Dear Madame Inspector General:

Thank you for your Report of Investigation concerning the investigation into potential financial waste by the Baltimore City Fire Department (BCFD or the Department) related to City-owned take-home vehicles. This letter constitutes BCFD's official response to that Report.

BCFD's practice is to conduct an annual (if not more frequent) comprehensive review of the Department's take-home vehicle distribution and related policy. This analysis always is conducted with an eye towards reducing the number of take-home vehicle assignments whenever operationally feasible, while simultaneously considering the demands for efficient and effective performance of BCFD's emergency operational response. For instance, in FY 20, BCFD's comprehensive review resulted in the reduction of the number of take-home vehicles by ten (10).

Based on the results of the OIG's Report of Investigation, BCFD intends to again closely review the current take-home vehicle distribution and related policy to make adjustments as possible, while balancing the need to maintain the highest level of emergency response. We appreciate your review and investigative findings, as we continuously strive to provide the very best service to the citizens and visitors of Baltimore, while taking into account the need to avoid potential financial waste.
