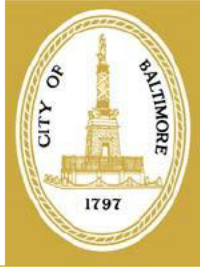

Dear Inspector General Cumming:

In response to the Management Alert OIG Case No. 23-0023-I, [REDACTED], we have completed a thorough review of the presented findings and determined [REDACTED] violated several City policies.

Based on the facts in this case, the following was substantiated: [REDACTED] violated the Confidentiality Agreement which prohibits sharing Departmental information without first obtaining approval from the Department's Director and/or vetting the sharing of information through the MPIA process. This confidentiality agreement was signed by [REDACTED]. Additionally, [REDACTED] violated the City's Electronic Communication Policy (AM-118-1) signed by [REDACTED].

After conferment with the City's Law Department and DOT's HR division, we decided to terminate [REDACTED]. Out of an abundance of caution, we will remind all DOT employees about the Technology Acceptable Use Policy (AM-118-1).
